

TO GOD BELONGS THE GLORY.

“Because when they Knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful, but became vain in their imagination, and their foolish heart was darkened, professing themselves to be wise, they became fools, and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man, and birds, and four footed beasts, and creeping things,” (Romans 1:21-23).

These scriptures are not talking about Atheist, or Satan worshippers, nor an outright sinner, but about Believers “When they knew God” they glorified him not as God; neither were thankful. How long has it been since you thanked God for anything, for just waking you up this morning? People say we know him, but where is his praise, his glory?

“There was a king named Herod, that sat on his throne, arrayed in royal apparel, made an oration unto the people, and the people gave a shout, saying, “It is the voice of a God, and not a man: and immediately, the angel of the Lord smote him, because he **gave not God the glory**, and he was eaten of worms and died.

When will we realize, if ever, to God belongs the glory, and to him alone. The lust for power is consuming the world; it drives men to cheat, steal, to degrade their fellowman, any thing to get what they want and where they want to go. But they

fail to realize that Jesus has “all power in heaven and the earth.” The only power that man has is what God permits him to have.

Jesus is not concerned about our material things, our homes, our cars, nor the money we have accumulated over the years, everything we have, God has permitted us to have, it all belongs to Him. All of these things can be gone in an instant. All Jesus has to do is blow on them. Hurricanes, floods, fires, drought, Jesus alone has control over all these things, which it seems people fail to realize, or forget. It is not Mother Nature, but Jesus alone. **He is a jealous God**, He will have **no other God before him**.

We heap more honor on Politician, movie actor, athletes, Rock Stars, than we do on the Creator of all the heaven and the earth.
